

Dr. Pratik Pandharipande is a Professor of Anesthesiology and Surgery at Vanderbilt University Medical Center, and the Co-Director of the Critical Illness, Brain Dysfunction, and Survivorship (CIBS) Center in Nashville, TN. He is Board Certified in Anesthesiology with a Subspecialty Certification in Critical Care Medicine, followed by a Master in Science and Clinical Investigation. Dr Pandharipande's clinical focus is ICU consultancy in the Surgical ICUs at Vanderbilt University Medical Center and the VA Nashville.

Dr. Pandharipande's research focus is in understanding the epidemiology of ICU-associated brain injury (manifested acutely as delirium and chronically as cognitive impairment) and in improving survivorship. He has conducted seminal studies evaluating the role of sedation in these brain dysfunction

Biography:



Seven Habits for Highly Safe



Dr. Della Lin

Dr. Della Lin is a board member with the Anesthesia Patient Safety Foundation and serves as an officer on the executive committee. She is noted for her speaking through an engaging balance of science and storytelling and is a frequently sought after speaker.

Dr. Lin is a practicing anesthesiologist in Honolulu and a leadership coach, with her own leadership career spanning over 3 decades. Dr. Lin hold an Associate Faculty appointment with Ariadne Labs-- a joint center for health systems innovation at Brigham and Women's Hospital and the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health, is a Salzburg Global Fellow, and serves as faculty for the Institute for Health Care Improvement. While partnering as Visiting Faculty with the Johns Hopkins Armstrong Institute for Patient Safety and Quality, Dr. Lin led cross-continuum community collaboratives, including leading the Hawaii CUSP-STOP BSI and Hawaii Surgical Unit Safety Program efforts where statewide hospital-acquired infections were reduced by >80% and >65% respectively, and being part of the national team implementing the AHRQ grant around Enhanced Recovery after Surgery.

Dr. Lin was an inaugural patient safety leadership fellow with the National Patient Safety Foundation/American Hospital Association in 2002 and a Senior Fellow in Patient Safety Leadership with the Estes Park Institute for over 20 years.

She is the Chair for the ASA Adhoc Committee on Harassment, Incivility and Disrespect and the Cochair for the APSF Priority Advisory Group on Safety Culture as well as committee member and reviewer with Closed Claims at ASA's AQI. Dr. Lin has held numerous positions within hospital/departmental leadership including Chief, Department of Anesthesiology, Board Quality Committees, MEC and Peer Review.

My research interests are in the epidemiology of patient outcomes after non-cardiac surgery and the integration of implementation research with outcomes research. I am a member of the African Perioperative Research Group and served as a project manager and steering committee member of the African Surgical OutcomeS (ASOS) group. I am an investigator in the THRIVE study, investigating Trajectories of Recovery after Intravenous Propofol vs inhaled VolatilE anesthesia. At BJC, I co-chair the workgroup for harmonizing perioperative diabetes medicines management across the healthcare system.
