# Show Me the Significance of Your Hemodynamics Research

DR. LEE GOEDDEL

Dr. Goeddel grew up in St. Louis Missouri. After high school at Chaminade he attended the University of Notre Dame, Medical school at Johns Hopkins, Anesthesiology residency at University of Alabama Birmingham, and fellowships in cardiac anesthesia and critical care medicine back at Johns Hopkins....

Now Dr. Lee Goeddel MD, MPH is a Cardiac Anesthesiologist and Critical Care Physician at Johns Hopkins studying heart function and acute kidney injury using data science methodologies in large patient cohorts and directed patient-oriented studies that utilize tissue samples. His goal is to better understand the AKI disease pathway and identify modifiable exposures to guide management strategies in the operating room and ICU to reduce organ injury.

Recently he was awarded the FAER MRTG research award to support his research.

- 1) Discuss recent history of hemodynamic trials during surgery: Hypotension avoidance strategies have not improved outcomes
- 2) Outline current problem in hemodynamics and acute kidney injury (AKI) in cardiac surgery
- 3) Review 3 targeted studies to address these gaps that could lead to changes in practice

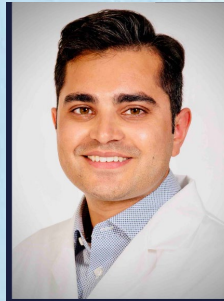
**Dr. Clayton Cheney**

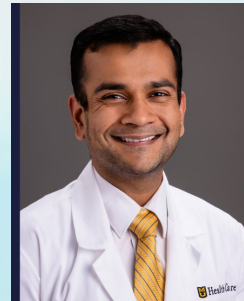

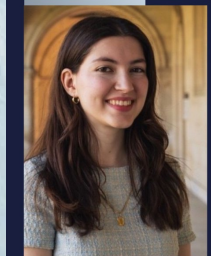
**Mazie Drummond**

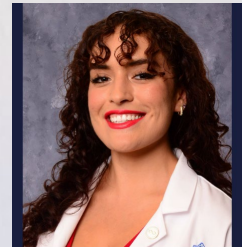
**Eric Lu**
